What's Next for One North?

Following a recent City Council meeting, a comprehensive article was written about the future of North Kansas City's "One North" (aka the Armour Road Redevelopment Area) by Thomas Friestad with the Kansas City Business Journal. North Kansas City is seeking new developers for the remaining 13.6 acres of developable land in the 64-acre One North project southeast of Interstates 29/35 and Armour Road. Four land parcels, between 1.1 and 6.8 acres, are left within what until recent years was envisioned as a \$217.5 million mixed-use development. You can see the areas marked 3, 4, 6 and 7 on the map above. Interested developers should respond to the City's RFP which will be issued soon. You will be able to find it on the City's website www.nkc.org

Although not part of the original master developer's scope, Meierotto Jewelers is the most conspicuous occupant of the One North area. Other businesses in One North include the Aloft and Element Hotels, the Diamond Conference Center, the Backyard Apartments, the Ora Apartments, Starbucks, Burger King and an office building housing Orthopedic Health of Kansas City and Kansas City Urology Care.

Updated information about the KC Royals choosing North Kansas City

A decision by the KC Royals about a new stadium site is still unknown. But one of the obstacles for enabling a site in Missouri was removed when the Missouri legislature passed a bill during a special session to authorize major funding support for a professional athletic team to build a stadium in Missouri.

This was considered to be vital in order to compete with incentives that the State of Kansas can offer. Here is a comment from our state senator Maggie Nurrenbern: "The Senate ultimately voted 19-13 in favor of the stadium funding bill in the early morning hours of June 5. The House took up the bills on June 11 and voted 90-58 to pass the stadium bill."

Previously, the Missouri legislature had approved a bill sponsored by Senator Nurrenbern enabling Clay County to create a sports authority to be able to handle the details of working with a professional sports team.
