#### **Comments from the Public**

Kellen Mumm, VP with Chicken N Pickle, commented that the plan for the new Genesis Fitness Center in One North apparently includes indoor and outdoor pickleball courts. He stated that these features were not previously discussed when the Genesis project was discussed and will have a detrimental impact on other businesses in the downtown district which have been established and enhanced in recent years, bringing excellent recognition to North Kansas City.

#### **Agenda Items**

### **Amendment for Services for Proposed River Forest Park**

City Councilman Wes Graves commented critically about what he considered excessive costs of preconstruction engineering services purchased for projects like the proposed River Forest Park. The agenda item specified \$175,560 for services to be provided by SWT Design. Other City Council members commented that these studies provide a form of due diligence to make sure projects are feasible and will be properly constructed. The amendment was approved.

#### Proposed Ballot Issue: Sales Tax on Recreational Marijuana

City Council opted to defer this to be considered for a Fall 2023 election so that the only tax issue on the April ballot will be for the proposed Parks and Recreation tax.
